DISCLOSURE AND BARRING SERVICE (DBS) certification (formerly called CRB check) is required by all who work in the parish with children and vulnerable adults. If you're 18 or over and your parish ministry requires you to visit people in their home, care homes, hospital, or if you work with young people in the parish who are under 18, you must have a DBS certificate which is no older than three years. Many are in the situation of needing to review their old documentation and this must be done immediately. Please see Fr Liam after Mass to collect a form or speak with Angela Dullaghan our parish safeguarding rep on 01437 764038. I know all of us would want to ensure the highest standards of safeguarding for vulnerable members of our community, and I thank you all for your prompt cooperation in safeguarding matters. If your DBS certification becomes too old, you will be asked to refrain from your ministry until fresh documentation is obtained.

KEY HOLDERS of the parish estate are numerous and there is no definitive register of who owns which keys! In order to maintain the security of the parish estate, and to satisfy possible insurance requirements, I kindly ask that everyone who has a key signs the register. Please come to the sacristy after Mass to fill in the form. If you have a key which you no longer require, please return it to Fr Liam or Rev. Tony. This includes keys for both churches, the hall, garages and the presbytery.

FORGET-ME-NOT BABY ANNUAL MEMORIAL SERVICE is open to everyone, especially those who may have lost a baby during pregnancy or birth, or at an age which was far too young. This ecumenical service will be led by the Hospital Chaplains in St Luke's Chapel at Withybush Hospital on 21st September at 6:30pm.
