Saint of the Week Christianity first came to Korea through laypeople in the early 1600s. In its first 150 years about 10,000 Christian converts were executed. The first priests to arrive in Korea came many years later and were Jesuits. The first of them was beheaded after 3 years in 1836. St Andrew Kim Taegôn was the first native-born priest who was ordained in Macao in 1845. He was executed with his father St Paul Chong Hasang in 1846 and many others perished at the same time. On Tuesday 20th September, the Church recalls 103 Korean Martyrs who are mostly lay men and women with some children.
