Saint of the Week St Luke is regarded as the author of the Gospel which bears his name and is also the author of the Acts of the Apostles. He is considered to have been an apostle of St Paul, who refers to him as being a physician in his letter to the Colossians. From the 8th Centaury a tradition developed that he was a painter and the first icon writer. As well as being the patron saint of surgeons, he's also the patron of iconographers. He died around the year 84 and today most of his remains are in the Benedictine Abbey of Padua. In art he is often depicted with a winged bull or ox.
