SAINT OF THE WEEK Born in 972AD, St Henry was the son of the Duke of Bavaria and his mother was descended from the King of Burgundy. At the death of his cousin, Otho III, in 1002AD, Henry became the second Holy Roman Emperor to bear that name. Later on he added 'King of Italy' to his titles. His reign marked a centralising of power within the European continent and Henry was not without enemies. However, his humility and spirit of justice were equal to his zeal for religion. He was to become an Oblate of the Benedictine order, but never a full member. His wife, St Cunegundes is also noted as a saint of the Church. St Henry is the Patron Saint of Dukes, those with disabilities and those unable to join religious orders.

Confession and Exposition Times The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated weekly at St David and St Patrick's on Saturday evenings from 5:15pm to 5:45pm and at Narberth before the Sunday evening Mass. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament generally takes place on Monday mornings after the Mass from 10:30am to 11:30am.

Apostleship of the Sea (AoS) This weekend is Sea Sunday when we keep in mind the work of the AoS and those who spend the greater part of their working life at sea. The AoS is the official maritime and welfare and mission agency of the Catholic Church in Great Britain, supporting over one million seafarers each year: that's 1/3 of the population of Wales, many of whom share our Catholic faith. The AoS can be found at many ports including Milford Haven and Port Talbot, both within our Diocese. As requested by the bishops of England and Wales, there will be a second collection this weekend to support the AoS.
