SAINT OF THE WEEK Bruno was born at Cologne about the year 1030 and was ordained a priest around 1055. He was sent to Reims where he ran a very successful school for 20 years. Following this he was placed in charge of the administration of the diocese and during that time he sought the help of Pope Gregory VII to suspended the bishop (who was more a violent aristocrat than a man of God). Bruno then invited to take become a bishop himself and to take full charge of the diocese. Bruno however, was not set on the idea and instead retreat to a life of quite contemplation. He joined the Cistercians for awhile but eventually founded the Carthusian order
