

<u>Wednesday next</u> is ASH WEDNESDAY, the beginning of the LENTEN SEASON, our 40 days of spiritual preparation for HOLY WEEK and EASTER. During this period we are asked to reflect on our position in the sight of God and to try to remove obstacles to His plan for us. The Church emphasises three particular practices: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. It is customary for Catholics to attend Mass on this day and receive the Blessed Ashes. Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence. Try to avail of one of the 3 Masses offered in the Parish.

There will be EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT in the Church on Monday ,10.30 - 11.30am/. There will be EXPOSITION available each weekday from 7 - 8am. Entry to the Church only by the Front Door There is EXPOSITION in our Church at Narberth most weekday at 12 noon.

As usual the WALK WITH ME Booklets will be available for use during Lent with daily reflections. They will cost £1 each. Put thr money in the Paper Boxes. They will be a valuable help in your spiritual preparation for the Holy Week Celebrations.

In response to the Popes request all families are invited to have an input into the second SYNOD ON THE FAMILY to be held in Rome in October. You are asked to fill in your answers to the 6 Questions on the <u>Questionaire</u> and place them in the BOX provided after Easter. There is <u>one Question</u> every <u>two weeks</u>. The Question repeated this week is:

## WHAT ARE YOUR STRUGGLES AND FEARS OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE TODAY?

You should keep all your observations on the <u>six Questions</u> and place them in one envelope and place it in the BOX provided in the Porches on Sunday after Easter (April 12<sup>th</sup>). Pat Murphy will lead a DISCUSSION GROUP in the Resource Room on <u>Thursday next</u> which will help to clarify some aspects of this weeks <u>Question</u> and so help you in your answers.

You are very welcome to come into the Hall after the 10am Mass for tea, coffee, and light refreshments, I am grateful to those parishioners who provide this to brighten up the occasion .Do drop in for a short while to exchange greetings in a warm and friendly atmosphere. We need to get to know each other and in this way build up a community spirit so vital to a vibrant parish life.
