

Home Mission Sunday: This year's theme: Evangelisation 'in the heart of the family'. Many children and young people will never see their parents receive the sacraments. On 21 September 2014 the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales ask that Home Mission Sunday is celebrated in every parish to invite prayer and support for the work of evangelisation.
