Parish Building Works Welcome home to a newly decorated church! So, what has been done? In short, we've had a new porch roof, the soffits were replaced where degraded, windows have been restored, the external woodwork has been repaired and painted, external ironwork has been painted, the consecration candles have been lowered and made usable, the electrics have been replaced and old equipment taken away, the hearing-loop has been replaced and the sound system relocated, damp damage to walls has been removed and a treatment added to limit future damp, there's been a full interior repaint, the floor has been cleaned, polished and buffed, and the carpets have been replaced and the altar surrounded to give it a solid presence. In addition to works in the church, the hall and sacristy have been repainted and the flagstones power-washed. At Narberth the cloakroom has been refurbished and a new boiler installed, the sacristy has been repainted and the polystyrene roof tiles replaced with a proper ceiling. Ongoing works include the need to install proper lighting in Haverfordwest and to complete the remodeling of the sacristy and porch area at Narberth.

I am so thankful for the vast army of people who have so generously given of their valuable time to help on this project. This has been a real parish effort and I'm so proud that together we've made for ourselves a worthy church. Several have said to me how grateful they are that I've done all this work – and how wrong they are. I've done nothing more than put a stamp on the envelope to the Historic Churches Committee to get planning permission. Everything else has been done by you. I'm told that you should never thank groups of people by name as you may miss someone out. Nevertheless, there is one particular person who needs to be mentioned. Without the effort of Bill Donovan our church would not be as it is now, This parish owes him a certain mark of gratitude because he has given more than can be expected, and has gone further than even the extra mile. I think he has spent more time over the past 3 months in the parish, than he has spent in the family home: his car was on my drive as I got up in the morning and sometimes it was there when going to bed at night! Thank you Bill for all that you have done for us and thank you to all those who have been involved in cleaning, washing, moving, painting, restoring, driving, making cups of tea and so on and so on. May you all be richly blessed.
