SAINT OF THE WEEK The proclamation of the date of Easter, Pentecost and other moveable feasts in the liturgical year, dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary for the Church to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depended on advance knowledge of this date. Although calendars now give the date of Easter and other feasts for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It's a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of our faith, which are celebrated at the turning of the seasons.

BLESSING OF HOUSES If you wish to bless your house for the year ahead, feel free to take some of the blest chalk and inscribe 20+C+M+B+18 over the lintel of the door saying: "Visit O Lord this house with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love. May we grow in grace, and knowledge of you, who are our comfort, guide and strength. Keep us in your peace now and forever. Amen."
