Saint of the Week. This week the Church Enters the period of Passion Tide, an intensification of the season of Lent as we approach Palm Sunday next week. This week, on Monday, we also celebrate the Feast of St Joseph, the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Co-Patron (with St David) of the Diocese of Menevia. A silent figure in the scriptures, Joseph was, nevertheless, a faithful witness to a father and husband's love. He supported his wife and her Son, Jesus Christ. St Joseph is the Patron saint of Fatherhood and carpenters.
