**Saints of the Week** – St Norbert of Xanten (1080-1134) was born in Germany and was a bishop of the church as well as the founder of the Canons Regular and the Premonstratensians (more often called the Norbertine Order). He was a nobleman and tried to reform religious life in the areas which he lived. He was ordained as a subdeacon, but didn't become a priest until later in life following a near-death experience, when his horse was struck by lightning and he was left unconscious for some hours. The Canons he founded follow the rule of St Augustine and St Norbert was canonized in 1582.

**Confession and Exposition Times** The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated weekly at St David and St Patrick's on Saturday evenings from 5:15pm to 5:45pm and at Narberth before the Sunday evening Mass. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament generally takes place on Monday mornings after the Mass from 10:30am to 11:30am.

**Sick and Retired Clergy** This weekend there will be a second collection at all Masses to help support the sick and retired clergy of our diocese. Please do remember our older clergy in your prayers as they step back from public ministry.

**Dementia Awareness Evening** The Bishops' Conference Mental Health Project has allowed our diocese access to funding for each deanery to have an evening on dementia awareness. In the Pembrokeshire Deanery this will take place at our parish hall on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> June at 5:00-7:00pm. The presentation is given by an expert, and places are limited per parish. If you would like to attend, please speak with Fr Liam. Preference will be given to those who have a family member with dementia, or who regularly visit people with dementia in their role as members of the SVP, or who are extraordinary ministers etc. **GDPR** The new data policy on how your personal information may be stored and/or processed is now available on the parish website and Facebook page. If you do not have access to these media, then please ask for a copy from Fr Liam. The Diocese needs your consent to keep information about you and, as such, has produced a consent form which you should find in your place at all Masses this weekend. These need to be filled in and returned to Fr Liam if you wish the diocese (and by extension, the parish) to remain in contact with you. Please do print clearly so that your details can be read. Please do remember that each person needs to give their own consent: the head of a household cannot fill-in one sheet for all the family and a wife or husband cannot fill in the form for both themselves and their spouse.
