Saints of the Week Born in 972AD, St Henry was the son of the Duke of Bavaria and his mother was descended from the King of Burgundy. At the death of his cousin, Otho III, in 1002AD, Henry became the second Holy Roman Emperor to bear that name. Later on he added 'King of Italy' to his titles. His reign marked a centralising of power within the European continent and Henry was not without enemies. However, his humility and spirit of justice were equal to his zeal for religion. He was to become an Oblate of the Benedictine order, but never a full member. His wife, St Cunegundes is also noted as a saint of the Church. St Henry is the Patron Saint of Dukes, those with disabilities and those unable to join religious orders.

Confession and Exposition Times The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated weekly at St David and St Patrick's on Saturday evenings from 5:15pm to 5:45pm and at Narberth before the Sunday evening Mass. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament generally takes place on Monday mornings after the Mass from 10:30am to 11:30am.

Parish Development In the past week we have been visited by the diocesan estates officer who, I'm pleased to report, finds our refurbished chapel a great job! Having toured the site it has been decided that the perimeter wall needs to be rebuilt/replaced: that will be dependant on whether or not the wall is covered by the church listing and if planning permission needs to be sought. It was also felt that the refurbishment of the resources room, and the introduction of disabled ramp and toilet, should be treated as one larger project not two separate ones. The next step is that two architects will soon visit and draw up some concept designs of what might be possible in the space we have. This will then lead to a refining of a final plan and costings being worked out.

Ordination Our new priest-to-be, Father Matthew, will be ordained at Swansea Cathedral on August 4th at 11:30am. If you would like to go to the ordination a bus will be departing from Haverfordwest and will also make a pick-up at the Penblewin rest area. If you would like a seat on the bus please make sure you write your name and contact details on the sign-up sheet after Mass. After the ordination there will be some refreshments served I the Cathedral Hall before the bus will bring us back home. On Tuesday 31st July at 7pm, I shall give an illustrated talk about what happens at an ordination Mass.
