HEARTY CONGRATULATIONS TO ARCHBISHOP MOST REV. MARK O'TOOLE...

On 9 November 2013, O'Toole was appointed the ninth bishop of Plymouth by Pope Francis. He received his episcopal consecration on 28 January 2014. He was the first new bishop of England and Wales appointed by Pope Francis. We pray with him for a fruitful ministry in the Archdiocese of Cardiff & diocese of Menevia.



APOSTOLIC LETTER – DESIDERIO DESIDERAVI: Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter reaffirms the importance of ecclesial communion around the rite that emerged from the post-conciliar liturgical reform. It is not a new instruction or a directive with specific norms, but rather a meditation on understanding the beauty of liturgical celebration and its role in evangelization. It concludes with an appeal: **"Let us abandon our polemics to listen together to what the Spirit is saying to the Church. Let us safeguard our communion. Let us continue to be astonished at the beauty of the Liturgy"**

Encounter with Christ: **"The Christian faith is either an encounter with the living Jesus or it is not. The Liturgy guarantees for us the possibility of such an encounter. For us a vague memory of the Last Supper would do no good. We need to be present at that Supper."** Pope Francis

PETER'S PENCE: *Peter's Pence or Denarii Sancti Petri or Alms of St Peter* are donations or payments made directly to the Holy See of the Catholic Church. It is the financial support offered by the faithful to the Holy Father as a sign of their sharing in the concern of the Successor of Peter for the many different needs of the Universal Church and for the relief of those most in need. The practice of providing material support to those charged with preaching the Gospel, thus enabling them to devote themselves completely to their apostolic mission and to care for those in greatest need, is as old as Christianity itself (cf. Acts 4:34, 11:29). By the end of the 8th century the Anglo Saxons felt so closely linked to the Bishop of Rome that they decided to send a regular annual contribution to the Holy Father. It was thus that the Denarius Sancti Petri (Alms of Saint Peter) originated and spread throughout Europe. Like other practices of its kind, this custom underwent many changes in the course of the centuries, until in 1871 Pope Pius IX gave it his approval and formalized the practice of lay members of Church and "other persons of good will" – providing financial support directly to the Roman See in the Encyclical Letter *Saepe Venerabilis* (5th August 1871).

Pope Benedict XVI said that "Peter's Pence' is the most characteristic expression of the participation of all the faithful in the Bishop of Rome's charitable initiatives in favour of the universal Church. The gesture has not only a practical value, but also a strong symbolic one, as a sign of communion with the Pope and attention to the needs of one's brothers; and therefore your service possesses a refined ecclesial character". The money normally collected is used by the Pope for philanthropic purposes. As of 2012, the United States has donated the largest amounts, giving some 28% of the total, followed by Italy, Germany, Spain, France, Ireland, Brazil and South Korea. US donations totalled \$82,529,417 in 2009.
