### **HEARTY CONGRATULATIONS TO ARCHBISHOP MOST REV. MARK O'TOOLE...**

On 9 November 2013, O'Toole was appointed the ninth bishop of Plymouth by Pope Francis. He received his episcopal consecration on 28 January 2014. He was the first new bishop of England and Wales appointed by Pope Francis. We pray with him for a fruitful ministry in the Archdiocese of Cardiff & diocese of Menevia.



**APOSTOLIC LETTER – DESIDERIO DESIDERAVI:** Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter reaffirms the importance of ecclesial communion around the rite that emerged from the post-conciliar liturgical reform. It is not a new instruction or a directive with specific norms, but rather a meditation on understanding the beauty of liturgical celebration and its role in evangelization. It concludes with an in appeal: **"Let us abandon our polemics to listen together to what the Spirit is saying to the Church. Let us safeguard our communion. Let us continue to be astonished at the beauty of the Liturgy"**

**Encounter with Christ:** **"The Christian faith is either an encounter with the living Jesus or it is not. The Liturgy guarantees for us the possibility of such an encounter. For us a vague memory of the Last Supper would do no good. We need to be present at that Supper."** Pope Francis

**APOSTLESHIP OF THE SEA:** Your love and generosity can make a huge difference to a seafarer and their family. Recently Olek, a Ukrainian seafarer, was working on the deck of a cargo ship when he had a serious accident. He fell into the hold and broke his back. He was taken to Hull Royal Infirmary for urgent medical help. He spoke very little English and had no family or friends here to support him. Fortunately, Anne McLaren, a Stella Maris chaplain, went and visited him in the hospital. During that first visit she found out that he was from Ukraine, his house had been bombed, and his family were still sheltering in the city. Can you imagine how it must feel to be seriously injured, so far from home? Worried about your health, not able to speak the language of your doctors? And knowing your family are trapped in the middle of a war thousands of miles away, and you are unable to help them? Olek stayed in Hull for several months while they stabilised his spine. Throughout that time, Anne and volunteers from Stella Maris visited him regularly and supported him as Good Samaritans. They arranged for a translator. They brought him clean clothes, toiletries, and mobile phone SIM cards so that he could contact his family back home. They made sure that he was not alone. He was not forgotten. He had a friend. Concern for the welfare of the stranger, and the value of friendship to those who are far from home, is exactly the reason why Stella Maris, Apostleship of the Sea, was established over 100 years ago. In the last year, more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. **Many seafarers are still being denied the right to leave their ships for even a short break away from the relentless noise and pressure onboard. Many are reporting more stress and worse mental health.**

And the war in Ukraine has added to crew shortages and shipping turmoil. But you can be a friend for seafarers in this time of need. Last year your generosity helped us to support over 100,000 seafarers in ports around the UK and many more around the world. This Sea Sunday, it will help us to provide vital support to seafarers like Olek and his family.
