HIS WORDS... YOUR JOURNEY... TOGETHER... *"To listen, the first thing that is needed is silence, deep silence, inner silence, that which we find in prayer. Very often our lifestyles are "full of noise..." The prophecy that Jesus asks of us is indeed to go against this grain, to seek out silence, to detach ourselves from the world, from noise. This permits us to pay attention and, with artisanal patience, to identify the different sounds, to weigh them up and to distinguish them. In such a way, that initial clamour begins to take shape; what seemed dissonant will be understood and situated, it will have a name, it will have a face. No note will be too high or too low, and no sound will be strident to our ears if we find the harmony that only our silence can give."* Pope Francis

POPE FRANCIS ON FAMILY: Addressing the Pontifical Theological Institute "John Paul II" for Marriage and the Family Sciences, Pope Francis highlights the need for the Church as well as the State "to listen and support families" in these turbulent times, reminding that the family is the very fabric of society. The Institute's aim is to provide a comprehensive understanding of marriage and family in light of the Catholic teachings, and of modern world assumptions regarding the human person. Its main mission is to develop interdisciplinary studies regarding marriage and family and to prepare graduates for teaching, research, and pastoral work in this field

Pope Francis, therefore, expressed appreciation for, and encouragement to the Institute's commitment to carry out that magisterial project "with coherence and creativity".

The Pope went on to insist that the mission of the Church urgently demands an integration of the "theology of the conjugal bond" with a more "concrete theology of the condition of the family", remarking that the "unprecedented turbulence" of our time which is putting a strain on all family ties, "requires careful discernment to grasp the signs of God's wisdom and mercy".

The Pope said, "We are not prophets of misfortune, but of hope. Therefore, in considering the reasons for this crisis, we will never lose sight of the consoling, sometimes touching signs of the capacities that family ties continue to show, benefitting the community of faith, civil society, and human coexistence."

CHURCH & SILENCE: The need to maintain a prayerful & silent atmosphere in the Church was felt at the Parish Meeting. It is a good observation and worth encouraging the same. So, kindly remember to maintain the prayerful silence in the Church, in order to pray & let others pray.
