BISHOPS IN WALES ISSUE STATEMENT AHEAD OF SENEDD ASSISTED SUICIDE VOTE

Archbishop Mark O'Toole of Cardiff-Menevia and Bishop Peter Brignall of Wrexham have expressed concern about the upcoming Senedd debate on assisted suicide set for January 27. They believe the proposal would significantly change society's approach to the terminally ill and advocate for improved palliative and end-of-life care to ensure dignity and comfort in patients' final days.

A day of fasting is suggested on Monday, 26th January, to stand in solidarity with the vulnerable and to engage respectfully with your Senedd member about this important decision for Wales.
